AD 1300- 1700	The 'golden age' of Edo. It has a large, powerful army and skilled craftspeople.	
AD 1489	The Edo people begin trading with the Portuguese, who call the place 'Benin'.	
AD 1553	The first British ships arrive in Benin. Britain becomes a major power in the slave trade and is keen to gain more control.	
AD 1897	The British enter Benin City without permission. Fighting breaks out (the 'Benin Massacre') and only two British officers survive. As punishment, the British launch the 'Benin Punitive Expedition' and destroy Benin City, stealing many treasures. The Oba is exiled and the British colonise Benin. What was the greatest thing that the Anglo-Saxons brought to Britain? Your own opinion—give reasons to back up your opinion.)
